The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Chairman Andy Bushman, with Trustees James McCaskey and Nathaniel McDonald and Fiscal Officer Todd Ray present. Mr. Bushman led the

The Trustees signed warrants 20348 through 20381 dated 8/13/24, totaling \$607,944.13; and the 8/30/24 bi-weekly payroll EFT vouchers 314 through 321 totaling \$9,907.75. The Trustees signed cemetery deed 5-391 for Peter Michael Padegimas, Maple Hill Cemetery section 3, lot 349, graves 12 and 13.

Mr. McCaskey moved to approve the minutes of the Trustees Regular meeting Tuesday, August 13 as presented. Mr. McDonald seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote. Mr. McCaskey moved to approve the minutes of the Trustees Special meeting for the Budget Hearing Monday, August 19 as presented. Mr. McDonald seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote.

Mr. Bushman asked for public comment. Munson resident Jeremy Rellinger identified himself as the scheduler for the travel teams and teams that use Munson ballfields. He explained to the Board that the Chardon Baseball League (CBL) is the recreational that includes players from Chardon, Munson, and surrounding communities. At this time, travel teams use Munson ballfields, and no CBL rec league teams do. The travel teams' coaches have traditionally provided in-season maintenance on the ballfields, but this has become increasingly more difficult each year, and the fields are declining. The travel teams are asking the Township to take the lead and coordinate the ongoing maintenance of the fields, determine a set cost, and let the travel teams reimburse the Township for the expense using fees collected from players and paid by the teams. The Trustees agreed to address the issue later in the meeting.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire Chief Mike Vatty reported that Munson Fire Department has worked with local schools to complete all inspections and required drills mandated for the start of the school year. He also reported that the Department experienced one "quadruple-call" event last week, when four emergency calls came in within a 50-minute period, requiring mutual aid support from neighboring departments to assure all four calls were covered.

#### **ARPA Fund request**

Chief Vatty noted that Fire Department Business Manager JP Szczyglowski had provided the Trustees with an itemized list of equipment needs and upgrades that the Fire Department was requesting the Township to fund using ARPA funds. (The list is included on the encumbrance sheet below.)

Mr. McCaskey moved to approve the purchase of the list of critical life-saving equipment including Life Pac 45 advanced cardiac monitors, Lucas mechanical chest compression devices, Blitz portable master-stream firefighting nozzles, TNT battery-electric ram vehicle extraction equipment, and fire-tanker braking system equipment for Munson Fire Department, in the amount of \$73,487.35 to be paid for with American Rescue Plan Act funds. Mr. McDonald seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote. Fiscal Officer Todd Ray confirmed with the Board that he would prepare a single payment to Munson Fire for the purpose of funding these purchases, and the Fire Department would place the orders and make separate payments to the specific vendors.

#### **ROAD DEPARTMENT**

#### Workers Comp Grant

Road Superintendent Kirk Walker told the Board that the application for a Workers Comp grant for a hydraulic lift for the Road Department had been approved, and the Township could move forward and order the lift.

Mr. McCaskey moved to approve the purchase of the Mohawk Lift for the Munson Road Department, in the amount of \$52,675.82. Mr. McDonald seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote. The BWC grant will reimburse Munson Township \$39,506.87 after the purchase.

#### Maintenance Building roofing

Mr. Walker noted that he had received a set of four quotes for metal roofing to reroof the salt shed and Building 2. He indicated the quotes were all competitive and from reputable roofing companies that he had vetted. The Trustees discussed the situation. Chair Andy Bushman pointed out that if the total of the roofing work exceeds the \$75,000 threshold, it requires publicly solicited bids, not just quotes. The Trustees will review the quotes and will take action at the next meeting.

#### **TOWNSHIP BUSINESS**

#### **Ballfield Maintenance**

Referring to the comments of Mr. Rellinger earlier in the meeting, Trustee Nate McDonald advised that the Trustees facilitate a meeting of the Township and the travel teams and Chardon Baseball League stakeholders to develop a plan for necessary in-season and offseason ballfield maintenance for 2025, and fellow board members agreed. Chair Andy Bushman pointed out that essential field maintenance for Zambory Field used for varsity baseball, referred to as Phase I, should be done this fall while it is dry enough, and avoid the problems that wet conditions create in the spring. Mr. Walker said that Innovative Companies was preparing a quote for the fall maintenance on Zambory Field. Phase II would include ongoing in-season maintenance and through the fall of 2025.

Road Superintendent Kirk Walker shared with the Trustees the quote for fall 2024 dragging and spraying of ballfields from Innovative Companies. The Trustees agreed that this work should be done in September and would be monitored and assessed through September.

Mr. McCaskey moved to approve the contract for maintenance of four ballfields by Innovative Companies, at the quoted price, twice dragging and twice spraying in September, not to exceed \$1,520. Mr. McDonald seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote.

### Resolution 2024-35: Sisters of Notre Dame 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commendation

Chair Andy Bushman called attention to the fact that the Sisters of Notre Dame are celebrating the 150 Anniversary of the establishment of their order in the United States. Mr. McDonald moved to approve Resolution 2024-35, a resolution of commendation of the Sisters' anniversary. He read the resolution aloud. Mr. McCaskey seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote. The resolution in its entirety is attached with these minutes.

#### Payne Family Chapel at Fowlers Mill Cemetery

The Trustees discussed an exploratory inquiry from the Payne family to establish a memorial structure of some kind for their family within the Fowlers Mill Cemetery. The Township does not have a policy for any structures in cemeteries. Trustees considered a number of variables, such as size and footprint of a structure, architectural oversight, and the need for a policy that would be applicable to respond to any future requests. They agreed to research other townships to see if any have policies that would help inform their response to this inquiry.

#### Croation Lodge/ H2Ohio Stream Restoration project contractor selection

Nate McDonald updated the Board on the process for selecting a contractor to design and execute the stream restoration project on the Croation Lodge property on Mulberry Road. The selection team recommended Davey Group out of Kent, Ohio as the preferred contractor. Mr. McDonald moved to approve Davey Group for the Croation Lodge stream restoration project in response to the request for proposals, with the project cost not to exceed the \$320,900 H2Ohio grant. Mr. McCaskey seconded. Motion carried with a unanimous vote.

#### Web Camera proposal

Andy Bushman updated the Board on the proposed web-based camera to be mounted on the fire station. Mr. Bushman said that Dave Jevnikar was preparing a final proposal and quote for the camera and installation and details on the web-hosting. The cost should not exceed earlier estimates of \$5,000.

#### Model Airplane Flying

The Trustees noted that Mr. Joe Otto had conducted a demonstration outside immediately before the start of the meeting. He operated a model plane "flight" without releasing the plane to fly, so that Trustees and observers could assess the audio impact of the electric motor on the plane. All agreed that the sound was not too loud and did not disqualify the proposal from further consideration.

Mr. McCaskey agreed to reach out to the Covia operations to request relief for nearby residents.
