The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Chairman Irene McMullen with Trustees Andy Bushman and Jim McCaskey and Fiscal Officer Judy Toth present. The Chairman led the Pledge of Allegiance. The Trustees signed warrants 15395-15424 dated 12/12, 12/13, and 12/29/17 totaling \$178,644.64, EFT Vouchers 490-499 for the 12/15/17 bi-weekly payroll totaling \$11,359.85, and warrant 1266 dated 12/12/17 for \$5,821.55 to transfer EMS collections. Jim McCaskey moved and Andy Bushman seconded to approve the November 28, 2017 minutes, as presented, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

#### **CEMETERY DEED**

The Board signed a cemetery deed reissued to Robert J. Walick and Christine S. Walick Trust Agreement for Fowlers Mill II Cemetery, Lot 98, Graves 3 & 4.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

No public comment.

#### **SHERIFF DEPUTY REPORT**

Deputy Eric Pavlick worked five days between November 20 and December 5, with 23 traffic stops – 5 tickets and 18 warnings, approx. 5 stops a day. He responded to various calls, including a fraud report, and a robbery at the Marathon located at Routes 44 and 322. The robber was apprehended.

#### 208 PLAN/LEGEND LAKE GOLF CLUB

Attorney Todd Petersen, representing the owners of the Legend Lake Golf Club, was present to discuss a proposed 19-home conservation development on Legend Lake Golf Club property abutting Auburn and Thwing Roads. The Trustees received a copy of the plans. The developers want to tie into a sewer treatment plant mandated by the Ohio EPA for the Chardon Township Berkshire Estates development. The location for the treatment plant has not been determined. One consideration was the Legend Lake property in Munson Township. Resident Rich Ferlin spoke on behalf of abutting property owner Eleanor Semenik, who could not be present due to the weather. She was concerned about placing the homes on flag lots less than one acre, while the balance of the 50 acres would remain a golf course, and about amending the 208 Plan with no benefit to the Township. Asked where he was with water resources, Mr. Petersen advised that he had had no further contact with them. Mr. McCaskey was not interested in a proposal for only 19 homes, and not the entire golf course. Petersen pointed out that as a business venture, it would not be profitable to develop the entire property. A clean river would be the benefit to Munson Township. Curb cuts in the proposed development will be kept to a minimum, three on Auburn and three on Thwing. Mrs. McMullen asked if restrictions would be placed on the homeowners and if the homes would be visible from the road. Mr. Petersen discussed buffers and restrictions to cutting in the front. Mr. Bushman wanted to talk to water resources. Mr. McCaskey said he contacted them, and was told that they were waiting to hear from the Township and would prefer not to take the land by eminent domain. Mr. Petersen will continue to make his office phone number available to anyone who has questions.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT/FIRE AND EMS ADMINISTRATOR MARK LYNN

Chief Lynn reported that this has been a busy year for the department. There are still minor issues with two of the squads. The streetlights are up but are not on yet. The vehicles in the bay were reconfigured to accommodate the snowplow truck in the event that it would be needed for an emergency response.

#### RESOLUTION 2017-52/CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY/HEATH ROAD

Resolution 2017-52 was made by Jim McCaskey and seconded by Andy Bushman to request the Geauga County Engineer to prepare specifications for the improvement of Heath Road from Kim Drive to State Route 322, to resurface the existing width only, with a unanimous vote. 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#### ROAD REPORT/ROAD SUPERINTENDENT JIM TEICHMAN

At the request of the Board, Mr. Teichman will have road employee Mark Stukbauer look at the trees in Fowlers Mill Cemetery to see if he can do the pruning. The flagpole at the entrance to the town hall has a slight lean. Mr. Teichman was advised to remove the sand base and to reinstall it. McCaskey suggested that he wait until spring. The old flagpole will not be moved to the fire station entrance until the driveway is repaired to avoid tearing up the asphalt twice. Both issues will be placed on the agenda for April.

#### RESOLUTION 2017-46/CHANGE ORDER/RONYAK PAVING

Resolution 2017-46 was made by Andy Bushman and seconded by Jim McCaskey to approve Change Order No. 1 to the contract with Ronyak Paving, Inc. for the Widening and Asphalt Resurfacing of Fowlers Mill Road, original contract amount \$334,552, total additions \$18,906.22, total deductions \$35,687.30, for a revised contract amount of \$317,770.92, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

#### Invoice No. 2

Jim McCaskey moved and Andy Bushman seconded to authorize payment of Invoice No. 2 to Ronyak Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$38,604.97, for the Widening and Asphalt Resurfacing of Fowlers Mill Road, with the Township to pay the local match of \$19,302.48, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

#### **CELLULAR PHONE POLICY**

The Board will address the cellular phone policy at the first meeting in January.

#### TOWN HALL CLEANING CONTRACT

Jim McCaskey moved and Andy Bushman seconded to continue custodial services with Charles A. Rosacco, Custodial Services & Supply Company for once a week cleaning at \$500 per month, from January 1 through December 31, 2018, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried. Mrs. McMullen advised that the Board of Elections can be assessed for cleaning costs when the township facilities are used as a public polling place.

#### AMENDMENT TO ZONING FEES

Andy Bushman moved and Jim McCaskey seconded to accept a change to the Munson Township Zoning Fees - that Other Zoning Fees shall \$75 instead of \$50, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried. [A copy of the amended zoning fee schedule is attached as part of the record.]

#### VARIANCE FEES/MIRAGLIA

The Board reviewed a request to waive one of two variance fees for Walter Miraglia for the former Pineview Lake property on Wilson Mills Road. The Board determined that both fees should be assessed as the request is for two different variances.

Mrs. McMullen advised that it was important to provide an opportunity for public input in the grant application process. The Trustees have the recommendations of the Park Board and Fire Department and a proposed layout. The public will be encouraged to call the Trustees with suggestions, which the Board will take into consideration when the application is submitted. Resident Rich Ferlin asked the Board to consider also the cost for ongoing maintenance.

#### RESOLUTION 2017-47/NUISANCE ABATEMENT/11040 MAYFIELD ROAD

#### Compensation

Mrs. McMullen addressed the sick leave policy. The assistant prosecutor advised her that "child" must be defined in more detail if stepchildren or foster children are to be included. She asked the Board to review Section 1.1 of the policy, which gives the Trustees the authority to amend the policy for an individual circumstance.

Mr. McCaskey read the revised policy. Jim McCaskey moved and Andy Bushman seconded to amend Section 5.4.D. of the Munson Township Personnel Policy, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

#### **BEAN ROAD TRUCK TRAFFIC**

Mr. McCaskey contacted the Sisters of Notre Dame regarding increased truck traffic on Bean Road, which was thought to be the result of the Notre Dame construction project. They believed it was primarily the electric and gas companies. The sheriff's office offered to provide a truck scale if the problem continues.

Mr. Bushman will submit a list of the mailboxes that need to be stabilized on Fowlers Mill Road. One of the mailboxes is damaged. He will contact the county to find out whether the township or county will do the work.
