RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS MUNSON TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES REGULAR

Meeting

Held Tuesday, June 21, 20 11

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Chairman Irene McMullen with Trustees Andy Bushman and Todd Ray and Fiscal Officer Patricia Bayer present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Warrants 9524-9557 dated 6/21/11 and 6/24/11 totaling \$147,387.87, EFT Vouchers 1724-1733 for the 6/24/11 bi-weekly payroll totaling \$10,537.79, and Warrant 1111 dated 6/22/11 in the amount of \$7,520.46, to transfer EMS collections from the lockbox to the primary account, were signed. Correspondence was available for review. The board signed the Legend Creek Surfacing contract, and letters of commendation to residents Dr. Sabrina J. Ellis, who earned a Doctorate of Ministry Degree in Transformational Leadership from Ashland Theological Seminary on June 4, 2011, and to Dennis M. Pilawa, of Rawlin Gravens Co., L.P.A., named an Ohio Super Lawyer for the third consecutive year.

OTARMA INSURANCE

Jim DeLucas of the Burnham and Flower Agency was present to update the trustees on new coverage and to answer questions regarding the township's property and liability insurance through O.T.A.R.M.A. [Ohio Township Association Risk Management Authority]. He discussed limits of liability, claims paid out for other communities, and explained injunctive relief and cyber liability coverage. O.T.A.R.M.A. is rated triple A, the highest financial rating. The surplus to writings ratio is 2:1. Munson currently has \$7 million in liability, and no aggregate. OTARMA will also allow the Board of Trustees to vote to allow a claim up to \$750 in Sovereign Immunity cases. For the past four years the Board of Directors voted to give dividends back to the townships from cumulated reserves through a VIP discount. This year townships received a voucher, and rebates will be paid out after the renewal. Munson will receive \$1,898.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire Chief Bernie Harchar discussed the recent tornados that devastated the State of Alabama and destroyed several fire departments. The Alabama Fire Service has placed a national relief effort for equipment. The chief would like to donate the used squad and several sets of turnout gear, no longer needed as the department's gear was recently replaced with the grant funds donated by Best Sand. The board asked who would pick up the equipment. Chief Harchar will investigate further and return with his recommendations. He discussed the replacement lighting funded by the NOPEC grant and advised the Tahoe will be a 2012 model. He will meet with county engineer Bob Phillips to discuss options for routing safety services during the Auburn/Sherman Road bridge replacement project.

MINUTES

Mr. Ray moved and Mr. Bushman seconded to approve the minutes of May 24, 2011, as written, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

Mr. Ray moved and Mr. Bushman seconded to approve the minutes of June 7, 2011, as written, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried.

ROAD REPORT

Road Superintendent Jim Teichman requested an encumbrance of \$12,760 to Henderson Truck Equipment-Ohio for a dump body for the new truck.

Recycling Center Improvements – He submitted estimates to provide dust control for the 20 x 400 ft. driveway to the recycling center in response to complaints the trustees received from the neighbors. The cost from Ronyak Paving for a prime coat to the base, of 355 gallons CRS-2 liquid, was \$1,527; the estimate for one coat of chip and seal, CRS-2 plus #8 limestone, was \$6,746.50, and double chip and seal, two coats of CRS-2 and two coats of limestone, \$8,896.50. He advised chip and seal would provide a good base for future asphalting. An alternative was to apply five to six truck loads of asphalt grindings to the driveway at an approximate cost of \$13.50 per ton. The board approved \$800 for asphalt grindings. Mr. Teichman also submitted a quote for 240 ft. of 6 ft. vinyl fence to be constructed on the property line from the southwest corner of the neighbor's home to the back property line to screen the parking lot and recycling center, and discussed removing the row of pine trees along the property line. Mr. Teichman suggested that a white fence would hold up the best over time. Mr. Bushman noted that white would show dirt, and almond, off-white, and beige were discussed. The property owners told Mrs. McMullen that health concerns were of primary importance because of the dust. The unsightly nature of the recycling site and their inability to use their back yard were also a frustration. Mr. Bushman said he was ok with the design and color, but wanted to make sure the neighbors were in agreement.

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ROAD REPORT (continued)

Millstone Culvert Replacement – A 120 ft. x 36 ft. concrete pipe needs to be replaced on Millstone Drive. The job will have to be contracted out as the pipe is too heavy for the township equipment. In addition, a trench box will be required. Approximate cost for the project is \$15,000. The county engineer will determine if the job can be done by force account or if it must be bid out.

<u>Four Tens</u> – The Road Department will begin its schedule of four ten hour workdays next week. If the rain holds off, the road department will finish the park projects - the retaining wall at the Scenic River pavilion, staining the benches and picnic tables, and mulching Nero Nature Preserve.

<u>Klatka Demolition</u> – The demolition of the buildings and restoration of the site has been completed at 10880 Mayfield Road. Three tandem loads of concrete were taken out. The site was graded and will be seeded and strawed. The road department rented a dumpster for \$400 to get rid of additional rubbish, and mowed the property. There are several dead trees, which they will take down as they are able.

CONCERT AT SCENIC RIVER

The trustees addressed a memo from Park Board Chairman Joe Rosboril requesting authorization to host a concert at Scenic River on Friday, July 22. There will be no cost to the township, as the cost for the band will be donated. They are looking at options to sell refreshments. Concert attendees will be asked to bring lawn chairs and blankets for seating. Mr. Ray moved and Mr. Bushman seconded to authorize the Park Board to plan the Party in the Park for Scenic River Retreat on July 22 from 7-9pm, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried. ZONING FEES/SHED BUILDING/RESTROOM PROJECT

Mr. Ray moved and Mrs. McMullen seconded to waive the zoning certificate fees for the Scenic River Retreat restroom building. Roll call vote: Mr. Ray, yes; Mrs. McMullen, yes; Mr. Bushman, no. Motion carried.

Mr. Ray moved and Mr. Bushman seconded to waive the zoning certificate fees for the road department storage building for the outdoor furnaces, with a unanimous vote. Motion carried. Mr. Ray moved and Mrs. McMullen seconded to authorize office manager Judy Toth to be the designated signer for the Scenic River Retreat restroom building zoning certificate application. Roll call vote: Mr. Ray, yes; Mrs. McMullen, yes; Mr. Bushman, no. Motion carried. There will be an EPA fee for the restroom project. Office Manager Judy Toth advised that the staff was watching the total cost for the project to make sure it did not go over \$25,000, at which point it would need to be bid out. Mr. Ray was committed to doing whatever needed to be done to complete the project.

TOWNSHIP HALL PROJECT

Mrs. McMullen brought up the question of the scope of the potential building project, and wanted to know on what points the board could agree. Mr. Bushman did not have a chance to talk to Leber Brown Architects. He advised he contacted a second architect and plans to contact a third. Mrs. McMullen read two sample resolutions in order to move forward with the project, one for planning, renovation, and expansion of the fire department garages, and the second for planning, renovation, and expansion of the fire department garages, town hall offices, and meeting space. Fire Chief Harchar expressed concern about Mr. Bushman's continued delay of the project. The board will not be able to move forward without consensus on the architect, and asked Mr. Bushman if he was willing to work with Leber Brown. Mr. Bushman advised he had a few issues to resolve and agreed to speak with them before the next meeting on July 12.
